Restrooms

Located on the Hilltop (see map on reverse side), Stone Quarry's accessible restrooms with composting toilets are open during the summer and fall seasons. The toilets can be used in the winter, but there is no running water in the sinks, hand sanitizer is available in both restrooms.

As you explore the grounds, notice art in the landscape--consider the paths, plants, scents, textures, colors, patterns, and sky, you encounter.

Stone Quarry's open fields and meadows invite wandering. There is no single trail-head, starting point, or end point. As you meander, here is a space for thoughts and drawings.

Stone Quarry Art Park is a private, not-for-profit contemporary outdoor art space founded in 1991. We believe everyone should have access to art and the outdoors. In addition to working with visiting artists to shape and re-shape the landscape of Stone Quarry Hill, the Park is open to the public every day of the year, from dawn to dusk.

Stone Quarry stewards the Hilltop House, the historic home and studio of artist Dorothy Riester. Visitors are encouraged to look in the windows of this mid-century modern, hand-crafted structure. 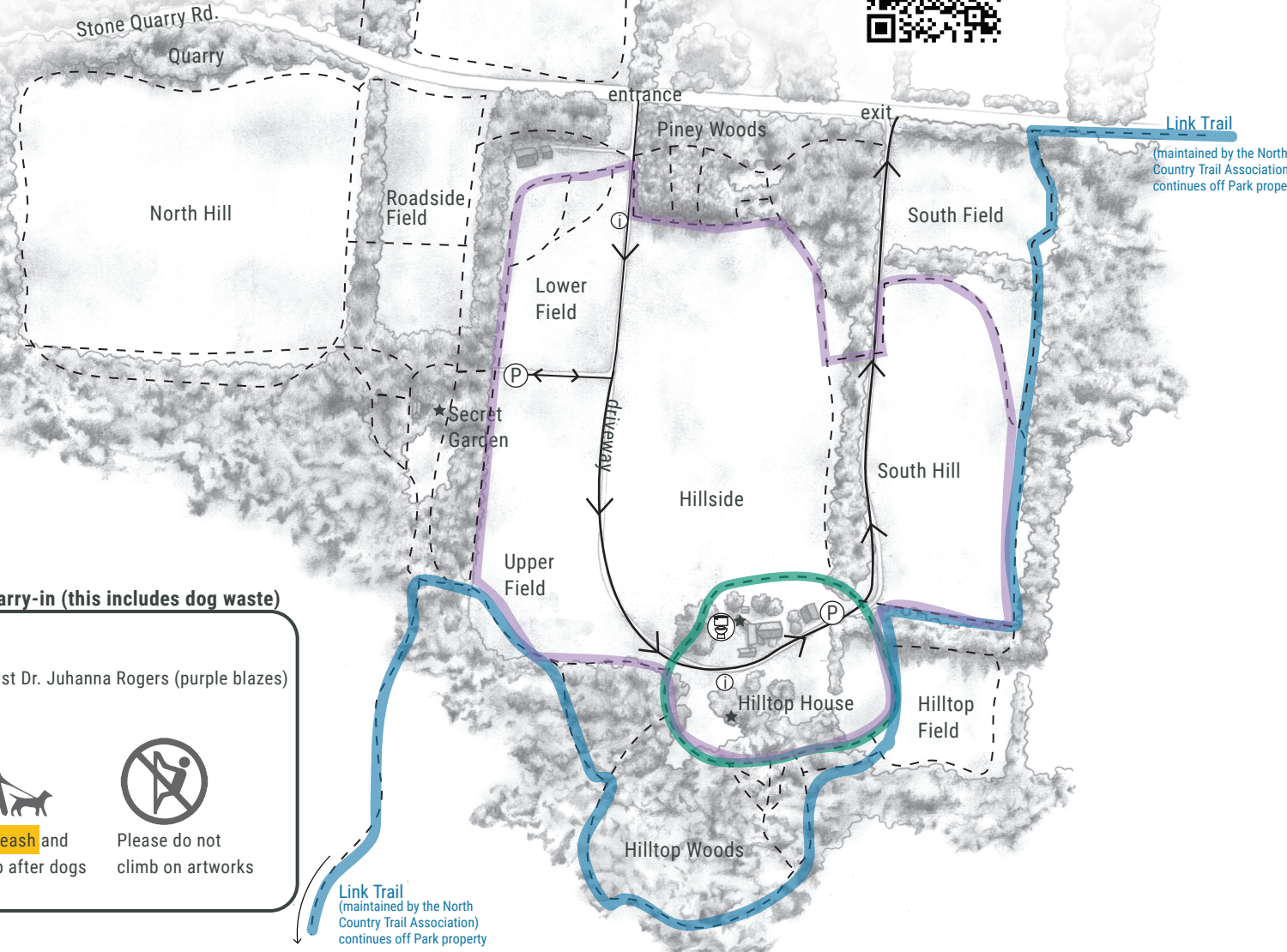

TRAIL SYSTEM









The trails at Stone Quarry are earthen, gravel, and mowed grass. The trail system totals about 4 miles and is marked with white blazes. In the winter, volunteers groom a trail for xc-skiing and snowshoeing. The North Country Trail Association maintains the Link Trail (blue blazes). The Link Trail continues off Park property.
